( PBI)**

Course Description:

This course teaches techniques of bomb scene investigation, methods used to identify materials, and analysis of evidence to identify perpetrators. The majority of this course is conducted in an academic learning environment using lecture, group discussions, case studies, and practical exercises investigating explosive blast scenes. The objective of this course is to provide the participants with the skills to investigate explosive incidents. Lastly, the course concludes with a small group exercise in which attendees prepare a notional plan on the training necessary to maintain PBI skills within their country.

Description of Duties:

Responsible for conducting classroom instruction, presentations and exercises in accordance with the guidelines and directives set forth by the Department of State Diplomatic Security Antiterrorism Assistance Program (ATA).

Responsible for ensuring only current ATA approved training materials (lesson plans, participant handouts, videos, case studies, etc.) are used in the delivery of ATA courses.

Responsible for returning **all** ATA training materials, including course CDs and ensuring that all ATA downloaded materials are deleted at the end of the course presentation by all instructors involved in the delivery of ATA courses.

Additional Duties and Responsibilities:

1. Liaise with DS/ATA Training Coordinator on all aspects of training and accept and follow any specific instruction provided by that DS/ATA Coordinator
2. Coordinate classroom preparation as directed by the lead instructor
3. Assist, as directed, with the drafting of the End of Course Review for submission
4. As directed, assist in the administration of Pre/Post Knowledge Surveys and summarize results utilizing ATA approved format
5. As directed, assist in the administration of Participant Skills Evaluations (when appropriate) and summarize results utilizing ATA approved format
6. As directed, assist in the administration of Course Critique and summarize results utilizing ATA approved format
7. Assist in the day to day operational activities as reflected

in the program of instruction

8. Interact professionally outside of normal training hours, as directed by the lead instructor, with course participants and training venue officials when appropriate and approved by ATA.

- General Qualifications:
9. Bachelors Degree or equivalent work experience in the field. Two years work subject matter related experience may be substituted for one year education.
  10. In situations where the subject matter is considered cutting edge procedures or technologies, evaluations of candidates credentials will be considered on a case by case basis.
  11. Specialized training shall include instructor certification from a recognized law enforcement local, state, federal or military institution.

  13. Familiar with curriculum Design/Development.
  14. Demonstrated operational experience in the subject area.
- Mandatory Qualifications:
1. Graduate of FBI Hazardous Devices School, FBI Post Blast Investigators course or ATF Post Blast Investigative training.
  2. Graduate of a Federal, State, or Locally recognized instructor development course.
- Preferred Qualifications:
1. Demonstrated capacity to deliver investigative training.
